

Fill and Waste Disposal Application & Permit

NOTE: Permit requirement does not apply to the following activities provided that the exempt activity is in compliance with all the provisions of the Village's Waste Disposal Ordinance and all other applicable ordinances, laws, rules, and regulations: backyard composting; placing fill material consisting entirely of soil, sand, and/or gravel used to improve property; animal waste properly spread and incorporated into the soil as a fertilizer or properly stored for such purpose; temporarily disposing of and storing and using, at the site of the project, inert sod, earth, and dirt excavated as part of a construction project; disposing of inert waste in connection with permitted mining activities; temporarily disposing of and storing and using, at the site of the project, materials used in a road construction project; and properly disposing of domestic and recyclable waste in accordance with the Village's refuse and recycling regulations.

GENERAL REQUIREMENTS

The applicant shall provide test results and engineering reports as needed to determine whether or not the proposed dumping will meet the criteria for approval of the waste disposal permit. Test results shall be from a certified lab identifying the levels of contaminants in the waste and confirming that the samples and tests were properly taken and administered. Engineering reports shall be certified by a qualified, licensed engineer. The Village may obtain such additional reports as it deems necessary, and the applicant shall reimburse the Village for the costs to obtain such reports.

I am applying for a waste disposal permit and agree that disposal of waste on the property that is the subject of this application will be in accordance with the Village of Maine Waste Disposal Ordinance and all other applicable ordinances, laws, rules, and regulations. Waste Definitions and Restrictions:

"Waste" means domestic waste, commercial/industrial waste, institutional waste, bulky waste, construction waste, demolition waste, and recyclable waste as further defined below.

1. Domestic waste is all residential waste other than waste defined below, and includes garbage (waste resulting from the handling, cooking, processing, preparation, serving, storage, and consumption of food, including animal, vegetable or other matter which is subject to decomposition, decay, and putrefaction) and other items as determined by the Village Board.
2. Commercial/industrial waste includes materials discarded by business enterprises, including but not limited to, offices, stores, restaurants, industrial plants, warehouses, and similar establishments or facilities. Commercial/industrial waste also includes bulky waste and other items as determined by the Village Board.
3. Institutional waste includes material discarded by schools, hospitals, nonmanufacturing activities at prisons and government facilities and other similar establishments or facilities.
4. Bulky waste includes but is not limited to freezers, refrigerators, stoves, clothes, washers, dryers, water heaters, televisions, dehumidifiers, humidifiers, water softeners, dishwashers, air conditioners, ovens, microwave ovens (capacitor removed), residential and commercial furnaces, boilers, and other items as determined by the Village Board.
5. Construction waste means building materials, packaging, and rubble resulting from construction, remodeling, repair, and demolition of buildings and roads.
6. Demolition waste means solid waste resulting from the demolition of buildings, roads, and other structures including but not limited to concrete, brick, bituminous pavement, wood, masonry, glass, trees, rock, plastic building parts, roofing, siding, and plaster, and other materials as determined by the Village Board. All concrete, brick, bituminous pavement, masonry, and rock shall be cut, crushed, or otherwise made smaller so that no material larger than six inches in diameter is deposited.
7. Recyclable waste includes materials banned from landfilling or incineration pursuant to state law, including but not limited to: aluminum containers; cardboard (corrugated paper); glass containers; newspapers; plastic containers; tin (bi-metal containers); magazines; office paper; steel containers; foam polystyrene packaging; and waste tires. Recyclable waste also includes other materials as determined by the Village Board.
